## GUIDELINES FOR PROPOSALS

### How to apply

Please send the following information by **30<sup>th</sup> April 2012** via e-mail to

- Document One: Title, abstract, and bibliography (see Proposals below)
- Document Two: Title, presenter's name, affiliated institution and registered programme, Email address, space and time requirements (if relevant) and AVS needs (see Technical Requirements and Resources below)

### Proposals

- An abstract of 300 words is required, outlining the research area and key issues within a clearly articulated methodology
- An indicative bibliography of 4-5 key texts should be included
- The name of the speaker and the title of the paper should also be included in a separate document as the abstracts will be blind reviewed

### Technical Requirements and Resources

- Presentations may take the form of a paper or lecture-demonstration
- Paper presentations should be 10 **or** 20 minutes in length
- Lecture-demonstrations should be 20 minutes in length
- If speakers intend to present a lecture-demonstration, please indicate what your space requirements might be for this
- Please identify any AVS equipment that you might need for the presentation, e.g. DVD playback, data projector, or Internet access.
